

IMPORTANT NOTICE

**DUTCH ELM DISEASE Confirmed
in Unity**



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This is something we need to take seriously. Dutch Elm Disease is a fatal disease of Elm trees that is spread by elm bark beetles. Once a tree is confirmed to have DED, it must be removed and the wood must be disposed of properly.

Anyone commercially pruning Elm trees in Sk must have completed a recognized pruning and training program or be supervised by someone who has. Improper pruning can increase risk of spreading disease.

DO NOT PRUNE ELM TREES UNTIL
SEPT 30

The restriction normally runs from
Apr 1-Aug 31 but since we have a confirmed case
in town we will be extending it.
